Greg J. Mastel's practice focuses on the formulation and implementation of international trade and tax policy by the U.S. Congress and the executive branch.

Mr. Mastel advises and represents clients regarding trade and tax legislation and related regulatory developments. Examples include the ongoing World Trade Organization negotiations, free trade agreement negotiations, trade remedies and disputes, and other factors that may affect market access for goods and services in the United States and abroad. He also advises and lobbies for clients on a range of other legislative issues, particularly international taxation issues.

Before joining Akin Gump, Mr. Mastel served from 2000 to 2003 as the chief economist and chief international trade adviser to the U.S. Senate Finance Committee, where he was responsible for developing all major international trade legislation that went before the Committee. Earlier in his career, he spent six years in various positions in the U.S. Senate, including chief of staff to Senator Max Baucus (D-MT), the current chairman of the Senate Finance Committee. During Mr. Mastel's tenure, he played key roles in numerous matters before the Senate, including passage of the North American Free Trade Agreement, extension of MFN trading status to China, and various tax and agricultural issues.

Mr. Mastel studied at Excelsior College and received his B.A. from Claremont College in 1986. He received his M.B.A. from the Edinburgh Business School in 1993.

Mr. Mastel is the author of *Antidumping Laws and the U.S. Economy* (M.E. Sharpe 1998), *The Rise of the Chinese Economy* (M.E. Sharpe 1997) and *American Trade Laws After the Uruguay Round* (M.E. Sharpe 1996). He has worked extensively with several think tanks, including the New America Foundation.
