**Greg Mastel's** expertise focuses on international trade policy matters, including providing advice to clients regarding the ongoing World Trade Organization negotiations, free trade agreement negotiations, trade legislative and regulatory developments, trade remedies and disputes, and other factors that may affect market access for goods and services in the U.S. and abroad.

During the 107<sup>th</sup> Congress, Greg Mastel was the Chief International Trade Advisor and Chief Economist for the Senate Finance Committee. During that time he was lead staff person on a number of important issues, including passage of the Trade Act of 2002, the U.S.- Jordan Free Trade Agreement and other free trade agreements, the integration of the U.S. Customs Service into the new Department of Homeland Security, and changes in U.S. tax policy related to recent adverse World Trade Organization decisions.

Prior to his position at the Senate Finance Committee, Dr. Mastel was Director of the Global Economic Policy Project at the New America Foundation. He was also the Director of International Trade Studies at the Center for National Policy and was Vice President and Director of Studies at the Economic Strategy Institute. He also taught graduate level courses at the University of Maryland and the Elliott School at George Washington University.

Dr. Mastel also spent eight years in various positions in the U.S. Senate in the late 1980s and 1990s, including Chief of Staff to Senator Max Baucus the current Ranking Member and past Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee. During this period he worked on many matters before the Senate, including passage of the North American Free Trade Agreement and extension of MFN trading status to China.

Dr. Mastel also frequently writes and provides analysis for *The Washington Post*, *The Los Angeles Times*, *The Washington Times*, *the New York Times*, *The Wall Street Journal*, and other publications. Dr. Mastel has authored articles for numerous journals, including *Foreign Policy*, *The Washington Quarterly*, *The American Prospect*, and *The International Economy*, and has appeared on CNN, NBC, ABC, *The Newshour with Jim Lehrer*, and *The Nightly Business Report*. He is the author of three books: *American Trade Laws After the Uruguay Round* (1996), *The Rise of the Chinese Economy* (1997), and *Antidumping Laws and the U.S. Economy* (1998).
